FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

Greetings and welcome all of our new members! As of the date of this writing, we have had 43 new members, since Nov 1st. Several new members from local clubs + the normal addition from golfers moving into the area have made this a really exciting time at Catta!

We have played with the idea of having some kind of mixer/ golf day to get the new members woven into our current roster. The intent would be to help create new friendships and promote some good nature trash talking! In the absence of a solid date or format to play, we have scheduled a new member orientation on March 11th @ 5:30. There will be several email reminders to follow.

Maybe one of the topics will be how to accomplish a get together all around golf. After all, this is why we play the game! On a really positive note, our project list is now a true active document and no longer a wish list! For the new members these projects will be flushed through our advisory committee and when time and resources are aligned, we will get things done!

On a silly negative note and for the record, I have washed my car several times, and it still has not rained! This will most likely be the new normal for this year. We have had to turn on the irrigation system and run it about 75% of its normal summer capacity. The "D" word is right around the corner for sure!

On the slightly negative note – we need your help! We have become the pull cart graveyard for far too many pull carts. I am an avid walker and promote this as much as anybody, but Houston – we have a problem. See the picture below!

What I am asking is we have all members come and pick up all of the pull carts that are stored at Catta Verdera. I know this may be an inconvenience... for some of the walkers so I share my sincere apologies.

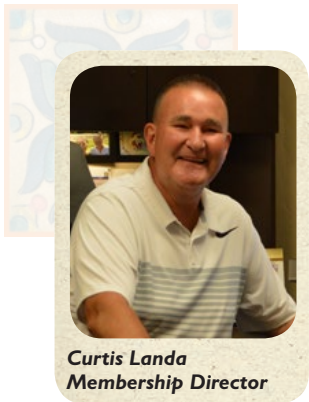
I have spent many months looking for solutions, but space below was not built to store both golf cars and pull carts. The pull carts in the picture are right up against the electrical panels which are not allowed by the fire marshal or our insurance carrier!

The club will be purchasing some free rentals (Approx. 10) for members to use. All we ask is members let us know and we can get them set up before you arrive. I have asked the advisory committee about which type of carts to purchase (see the picture above as an example). One objection was these were a little too big, and would not make some of the short cuts that walkers take. I find this ironic! :)

The time frame to get rid of all private pull carts will be the end of April since many members may be on vacation or not able to get to the club in short order. Again, this is not a service issue, it is a compliance issue with safety guidelines.

FROM THE HEAD GOLF PROFESSIONAL

Tee time bookings and club growth

Along with the excitement of becoming fully private and the growth which has accompanied it, we are beginning to experience a more impacted tee sheet. Tee time practices of the past may be changing in the future. Our goal is to create a new tee time policy that is the most fair and convenient to the greatest number of members. We currently have several 'soft blocks' on the tee sheet. These open groups are available to any member who wants to call

the shop and get their name on the list. Once they are full for the week they are full since the tee times around them fill in quickly. Starting in March we will begin alternating the weekend Catta Game times. The 1st and 3rd weekends of the month will have early times (currently 9:00AM; moving to 8:00 or 8:30 during the summer); while the 2nd and 4th weekends will have later start times (1:00PM). This will allow 2 things... 1) Players who want to find other members to have a game with will not be restricted to only morning times, and 2) Players not interested in joining an open game such as this will have more morning times available during 2 of the weekends each month.

Current booking policy allows you to book online or by calling the golf shop 7 days in advance. Online bookings open at 6:00AM and we currently begin answering the phone in the golf shop at 6:30AM. If you call the golf shop we allow 2 times to be booked per player (exceptions for this can be made for larger games) and if you book online you are required to book individual times, but it will allow you to book multiple 4-somes if you are securing times for a larger group. Also, if you have a group coming in to town, or some special event, we don't mind booking these 'one off' outings early to allow you to make plans for your group for the day. Just don't ask for ultra-prime morning times on a weekend if you want this.

One item that is critical for all our members to understand is that with the growth we have experienced comes a critical necessity of being courteous to your fellow members and cancelling any times you will not be using. *Note: Cancelling a time the morning of doesn't help your fellow members. Try to give at least a 24 hour notice, and preferably a 48 hour notice when you won't be using a tee time.

I'm in the process of putting together a member survey with regard to different tee time booking options. We know there will never be a way to create a policy that everyone loves or even likes, but our goal will be to create one which benefits the 'greater good'.

Guest Policy – Our guest policy has always been one round per 30 days, regardless of which member the guest plays with; meaning the same guest can't play more than once every 30 days even if he or she is invited by different members. It used to be that we didn't track guest rounds on Tuesdays and Wednesdays during times that we allowed public play. Now that public play is no longer allowed, all days and times count toward the 1 round every 30 days. The only official exception to this is if your guest is playing in a men's or ladies guest day. Those Guest Day rounds are not tracked towards the once every 30 days policy. Please relay this policy to your guests so they can help police themselves if they are invited by a different member. Our current tee sheet doesn't automatically run tracking for us and we do it manually, but the updated version which is coming soon will automatically track guest play and block guests from playing if it is a second round within the 30 day window.

Pace of Play and club growth

Another item of concern as we grow is our pace of play. Generally our members do very well to keep at or under our targeted 4:19 pace of play. On busy days this becomes more than a hopeful goal, it becomes critical. Try to police your own group and stay in position. Starting in April we will have extra player assistants working Friday – Sunday with their primary focus being maintaining a proper pace of play. Below are a list of real world tested and timed pace of play helps. Be sure to review the list and make sure you and your group of players are doing all you can to help you navigate the course a little faster.

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- After hitting a shot, don't immediately clean your club; get back in the cart, and clean your club and put it back in the bag when you get to your next stop. (for a 4 some, this could save around :10-:15 seconds per player per hole. = **12 minutes per round**)
- Exit the green immediately – Mark your score at the next tee while others are hitting. (:10 seconds per hole = **3 minutes per round**)
- Eliminate honors – hit when ready. (up to **5 minutes per round**)
- Limit or eliminate practice swings, never more than 1 or two; and remember if you take a full practice swing, it takes your muscles about 1 minute to recover enough to make that same swing again. Eliminating 1 practice swing per shot per golfer could save :05 seconds per player per shot, or **11-15 minutes per round**.
- Take two or three clubs with you to the tee and when you have to walk to your ball in the fairway.
- On the Green - Line up your putt while others are putting. (:15-:30 seconds per player per hole. = up to (**18-30 minutes per round**)
- On the Green - Be ready to putt while others are putting.
- On the Green - First player to hole out replaces the flagstick. (:10 seconds per hole = **3 minutes per round**)
- Try continuous putting. By not marking your ball after your first [or second] putt, you can save about :15 seconds per hole per player, or up to **18 minutes**.
- On the Green - Player whose ball is closest to the hole attends the flagstick. (Or come to a group consensus before the round that you will all putt with the flag in).
- If you remove your glove to putt or chip, make sure it is off prior to your turn to play. Likewise, make sure you have it back on when it is your turn to tee off. (Glove off or on = :05 seconds per occurrence, or up to **12 minutes per round** if all 4 players are unprepared)
- At the turn – Proceed directly to the 10th tee after picking up your food or beverage. (**5 minutes per round**)
- Watch errant shots carefully so they will be easier to find. Play a provisional from the tee if the ball is in the woods or a native area. And while we won't be using it in tournament play, consider using the new local rule for your daily games - Balls Lost or Out of Bounds: Alternative to Stroke and Distance: A new Local Rule is now available as of January 2019, permitting committees to allow golfers the option to drop the ball in the vicinity of where the ball is lost or out of bounds (including the nearest fairway area), under a two-stroke penalty. It addresses concerns raised at the club level about the negative impact on pace of play when a player is required to go back under stroke and distance. Again, it is not our plan to use this local rule in any of our guest days or tournaments, but for your regular group your "committee" may decide whether you would like to adopt it or not. (up to **5 minutes per occurrence**)
- On the Tee – Play a realistic set of tees for your ability.
- If you have a head cover that you struggle with getting on or off the club, keep it off during your entire round (if your putter cover takes you an average of :15 seconds to take it off, and another :15 to get it back on = **9 minutes per round**.)
- Your position on the course has nothing to do with the group behind you, but rather the group ahead of you. If every group on the course gives just a little extra "courtesy" distance to the group ahead of them, it adds about 3-5 minutes extra time per group. That means that without anyone on the course actually being significantly behind, the 10:00 group could be at a 5 hour pace thanks to all the early morning groups giving the group ahead of them an extra 3-5 minutes of "courtesy" space. Causing 5 hour rounds is the opposite of courteous so PLEASE; always stay in position right behind the group ahead of you to help them and the entire golf course keep pace.

*By following the above procedures you will be able to keep pace with any group ahead of you, regardless of ability. Nobody on the golf course outside your group cares how good or bad a player you are. The only thing that really matters is keeping pace so you don't affect the day of numerous other members. *Shaving 3 ½ minutes off your groups time for each hole will take 1 hour off your 18 hole round.*

FABERS' FOOD FOR THOUGHT:

Tips for Beginner/Intermediate Golfers: Each month I will highlight a tip for each of you to read.

I know that by now all of you have figured out your distances for all of your clubs. Good job ladies !!!

March Tip:

When to GO for it and when to be smart. I have seen many beginner and immediate level players get into trouble and try to make a one in a million recovery shot. What you should be thinking is-How do I get my ball back into the fairway? Take the one extra stroke to get back into the fairway and restart from there. It may not be an exciting shot but in the long run you will save strokes by not trying to go under the tree with several bunkers in your path or through about 20 trees with one small opening. What ends of happening is that you do not get out and your ball is still in an awful position and the strokes keep adding up. Get back to the fairway even if you have to hit the ball back towards the Tee box. There is no shame in playing smart. **Remember--If you get into trouble get out of trouble with the best shot back to the fairway.**

Superintendent Update

Mother Nature has blessed us with these magnificent temperatures. Everyone is loving the outdoor activities. It's hard not to, we have not had this kind of temperature (65f to 75f sunny with a little breezy) range in a very long time.

We were hoping to get some winter projects in before we went on full board manicuring of the course. However, mother nature has rewarded us with these marvelous sunny days and no rain. I know, we need the rain long term for usage in the summer.

Everyone in turf care is 100% dedicated to the manicuring of the course, rather than more winter projects. Nevertheless,
